

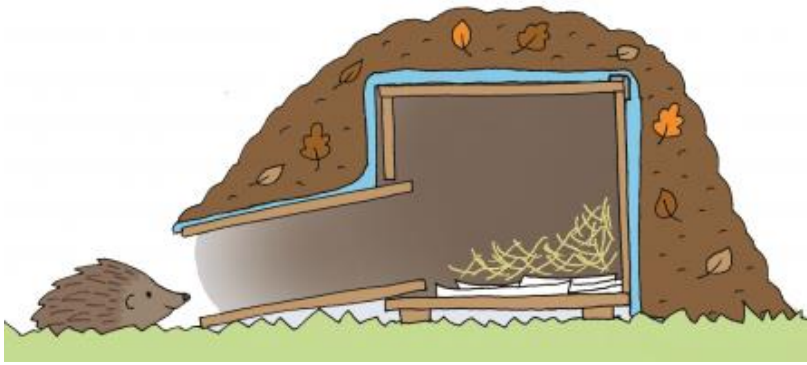

<p>Character traits are the individual qualities or attributes that make up your character, or personality.</p> <p>Character traits may be positive or negative and are often described using adjectives.</p> <p>Positive character traits, words such as loyal, honest, ambitious, or friendly. Negative character traits, words such as rude, selfish, arrogant.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Make a colourful paper chain and on each link of the chain, write down your positive character traits. 2. Write a list of all the positive character traits that you can think of. 3. Ask your friends or your family whether they can think of other positive character traits that you have. 4. Make a list of the positive character traits that you think your family and friends have. 5. Now think about negative character traits. 6. Write a list of all the negative character traits that you can think of.

In my assembly visits I meet lots of children who have ambitions to become an Archaeologist.

“Archaeology is the study of things that people made, used, and left behind. The goal of archaeology is to understand what people of the past were like and how they lived.

Scientists who study archaeology are called archaeologists. Some archaeological sites, such as ancient cities, are visible on the surface.

Archaeologists find clues about the past. They use a variety of extraction or digging techniques. Equipment like trowels, pickaxes, and even bulldozers help archaeologists coordinate and participate in fieldwork to attempt to unearth artifacts, such as pottery, ancient tools, seeds, or animal bones.” Credit: Twinkl
